Lecturer – Medical Sonography – Academic B School of Health, Medical and Applied Sciences

You will:

Make contributions to the teaching effort of the School and carry out activities to maintain and develop your scholarly, research and/or professional activities relevant to the profession or discipline. You will perform assigned teaching duties with students on and off campus with a standard of planning, preparation, presentation and assessment as necessary for students to achieve unit and course objectives.

You may also teach into vocational education and training (VET) units, provided that you hold the gualifications and experience that meet the minimum requirements of a Registered Training Organisation (RTO) as outlined in the relevant government Standards.

You are responsible for:

- Conducting tutorials, practical classes, demonstrations, student field excursions, clinical/studio sessions, workshops, and/or residential schools.
- Initiation and development of unit material.
- Acting as a unit coordinator. •
- Preparing and delivering lectures and seminars. •
- Supervision of the course of study of honours students or of postgraduate students engaged in unit work. •
- Supervision of honours or postgraduate research projects. •
- Conducting research (either individually or within a larger project as appropriate to the academic's abilities). •
- Involvement in professional activity. •
- Developing unit material with appropriate advice from and support of more senior staff.
- Marking and assessment. •
- Consultation with students. •
- A range of administrative functions, the majority of which are connected • with the units in which the academic teaches.
- Attending school and/or division meetings and/or membership of • a number of committees.

Demonstrated ability to teach and supervise undergraduate and postgraduate University students with experience engaging with tertiary students and supporting their educational development through multi-modal delivery strategies. Demonstrated ability to make a positive contribution to a team culture, through effective communication and interpersonal skills. Proven ability to contribute to curriculum development, writing and evaluation, particularly using flexible modes of delivery. Demonstrated capacity to engage and network effectively with industry and community partners and stakeholders.
