 Sonographer at SRG and also works part-time at Middlemore Hospital.
 She has been qualified in diagnostic ultrasound for more years than she

After the talks there will be an opportunity for live scanning with the aim of giving tips and pointers for finding "tricky bits", for improving the quality of your scans and answering questions you may have.
